Doc Savage is Bigger Than Ever

The greatest public relations job ever done for the movies is accomplished by the good old action-adventure films, the pure escapism type of story with a super hero, according to George Pal, producer of "DOC SAVAGE...The Man of Bronze" for Warner Bros., which opens next._____ at the _____Theatre.

Doc Savage was the forerunner of James Bond and other super heros, an invincible genius who in 181 fiction pulp magazines — which sold for 10¢ — saved the world fron malefactors.

"Most of the adults," Pal points out, "and practically all of the juvenile population of the United States has at one time or another been an adventure addict.

"What's more thrilling than a chase?" the producer asks.
"And that's what an action picture is from beginning to end. In today's disillusionec world, with its scarcity of clean-cut heroes, I think 'Doc Savage' will appeal to people of all ages."


Pal was encouraged to go ahead with his screen version by the success of Bantam Books reissues of Doc Savage's adventures. So far the publishing house has reprinted 74 of the novels and sold more than 15 million copies. The readers are not just old timers on a nostalgia kick.

Another interesting facet of the research has shown, that as the years pass, new and younger readers join the Doc Savage fan ranks, while older readers maintain their enthusiasm.


"Specifically," Pal says,
"I think the Doc Savage cult is
in some ways also a search back
to childhood and an idealization
of power. Doc Savage is the
master of everything, the world's
greatest surgeon, the greatest
chemist, the greatest inventor.
He can dodge a bullet and
smash through an inch-thick
steel door with one punch; he
appeals to people who desire
to be big and great.

"Everybody," smiles Pal,
"can identify with Doc Savage.
"He is the epitome of the free
man; he doesn't have to put up
with bosses; he is the greatest
individual of all time."

Ron Ely – Man of Bronze

Ironically, this is Ely's second superman role, having portrayed Tarzan on a television series during the late 1960's. However, his Doc Savage film role is one of those once-in-alifetime breaks. Both Pal and Anderson feel it will be the young actor's springboard to movie stardom.

It hasn't been an easy overnight thing for Ely. The road to potential film stardom began in a small Texas town.

Ron Ely was born June 2 in Hereford, Texas, and moved to Amarillo following the death of his father. To make his way while going to school he shoveled grain and worked summers as a "roughneck" on oil ries.

He subsequently won a scholarship to the University of Texas, where he studied radiotelevision. After a year he decided on an acting career and moved to Hollywood, taking odd jobs to earn money for acting class.

Michael Anderson directed the Technicolor film from a script by Pal and Joseph Morhaim.

Doc is a legendary figure whose crusades against evildoers made him the world's most famous crime fighter — a hero of superhuman strength and protean genius who stood for total goodness. As a true Hercules and more, he was the natural father of Superman and James Bond.



Synopsis

Crime fighter (Doc) Clark Savage, Jr. (RON ELY), a man of superhuman strength and protean genius, is engaged in a series of experiments at his Arctic laboratory retreat.

Suddenly, Doc receives telepathic thought from his circle of associates in New York, "The Amazing Five," the five greatest brains ever assembled in one group, telling him something is wrong. At once he heads for America and his penthouse.

Doc joins his associates, Ham (DARRELL ZWERLING), the world's smartest lawyer, Monk (MICHAEL MILLER), the greatest living chemist, Long Tom (PAUL GLEASON), the greatest electrical wizard, Renny (WILLIAM LUCKING), the finest engineer, and Johnny (ELDON QUICK), the world's greatest expert on archeology and geology.

They are waiting for Doc with some very sad news, that Doc's father has died from a rare tropical disease in the small South American country of Hidalgo. Doc suspects, however, that there has been foul play connected with his dad's death.

The group departs for Hidalgo in Doc's plane, unaware that Doc's deadly enemy, evil Captain Seas (PAUL G. WEXLER), the man behind the dastardly plot, is docked in the nearby Hidalgo Harbor aboard his yacht with a group of stunning women, such as Karen (ROBYN HILTON), Adrianna (JANICE HEIDEN) and surrounded by a collection of some of the world's most evil criminals.

Upon learning that a strange and distant lost tribe willed Savage Senior some mysterious land, Doc asks to look at the records in the land office of orderly Don Rubio Gorro (BOB CORSO). Unfortunately, only now is it discovered that the papers are missing. At this point a strange series of attempts on the lives of Doc and his friends ensue, but all are thwarted.

Doc then gets unexpected help from Gorro's incredibly beautiful assistant, Monja (PAMELA HENSLEY). As she grew up near the site of the lost tribe, Monja offers to lead Doc and his friends to it. They begin their dangerous trek through the wild jungle.

As they approach the area of his father's claim, Doc separates from the group to check the setup on his own. He discovers it is the site of a fabulous, eternally bubbling gold mine; the local tribe had given his father land worth billions! He finds that Captain Seas—intent on stealing the mine—has been operating here for some time—and is using slavery to force the tribe to gather the gold for him.

Monja and The Amazing Five are captured by Captain Seas' men and made prisoners in a dank cave. Captain Seas tries to kill them all using the green death virus he had utilized to kill Doc's father.

Luckily, Doc suddenly appears and overpowers the Captain, forcing him to release his friends, who are treated with a special antidote which saves their lives.

Meanwhile, the Captain's men attempt to escape with a fortune in gold. But wait a minute! Suddenly, an upheaval in the earth, caused by exploding dynamite, triggers the pool of bubbling gold to erupt, covering every one of the villains (except Captain Seas) with a shower of molten metal, and turning them into dead golden statues.

Tribal Chief Chaac, grateful that his village has been freed, gives the gold land to Doc, who intends to use it in his never-ending battle against evil malefactors. He returns to New York to his "Rehabilitation Center" with Captain Seas and performs a special kind of acupuncture brain surgery on the villain, turning Seas into a kindly Salvation Army band leader. This is Doc's method of dealing with the criminals he captures, correcting their criminal tendencies by brain surgery.

Just as Doc closes the book on this bizarre case, he receives another urgent call for help in battling a new band of villains — and he roars off into the sunset in his quest to make the world a just and good place in which to live.

We open on Doc at the Fortress of Solitude and after narration explains his work and noble purposes we cut to Doc returning to his metropolitan headquarters. There the Fabulous Five await him and an Indian assassin lurking outside. We see the assassination attempt fail and follow pursuit by helicopter and then car. The assassin falls to his death. Doc and the Fabulous Five take off in pursuit of the villains.

Excerpt #43 "Aerial Combat" 2 min. 35 sec.

As he steps onto his private plane Doc declares his Statement of Principle to the Fabulous Five. In the air Doc is pursued by one of the killers who pursue him. We cut to the killer announcing Doc's death to Captain Seas, Doc's arch enemy. Doc appears and Captain Seas fires his machine gun point blank into Doc's chest with unexpected results.






